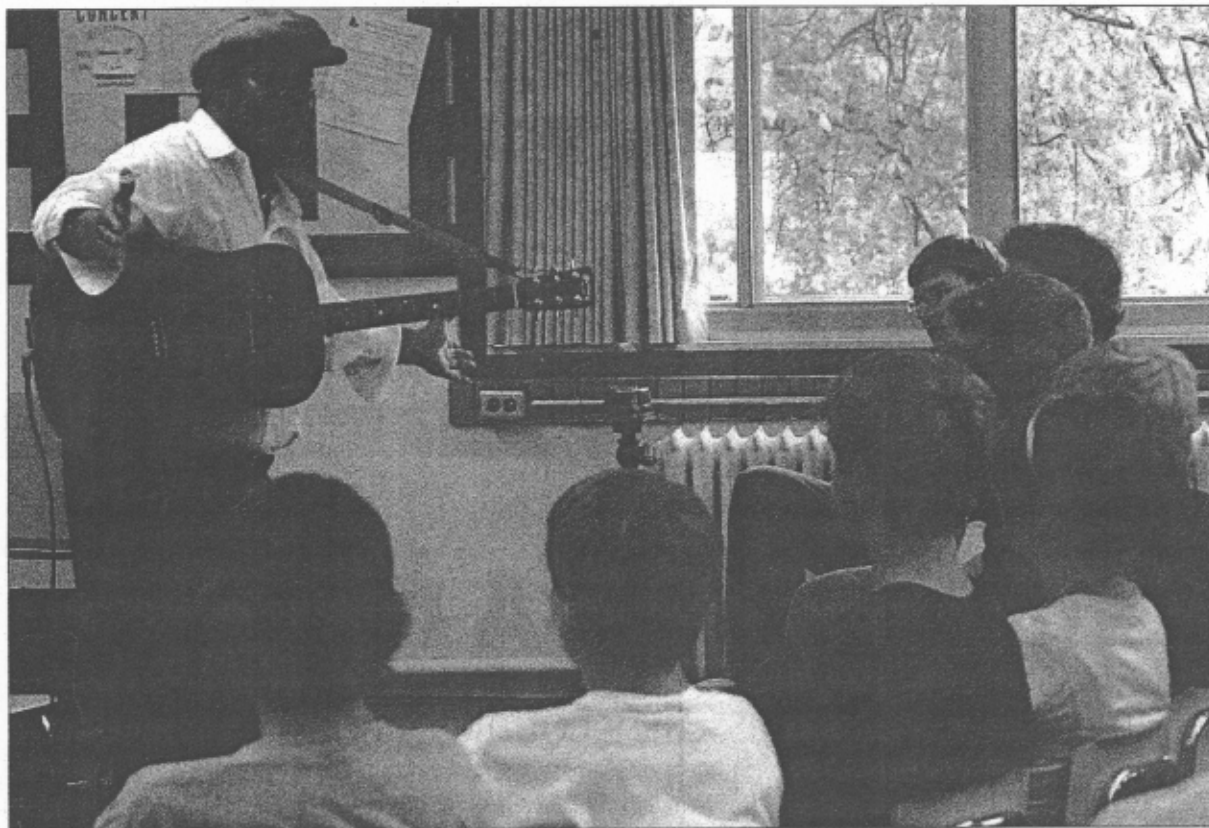


## BLUES IN THE SCHOOLS

Twenty homes in Ely recently had their drinking water tested for copper. This testing was conducted by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. The Commission under the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency adopted by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.
